- Provide evidence based information regarding vaccine side effects to families
- Discuss the diagnosis and treatment of headaches in children
- Identify important skin manifestations of systemic diseases in children
- Discuss the importance of vitamin D deficiency in children and the advantages and disadvantages of sunscreen use in the pediatric population
- Discuss endocrine conditions that may lead to pediatric obesity
- Describe the diagnosis and management of ocular trauma in children
- Describe current approaches to the diagnosis and management of thrombosis
- Summarize evaluation for common bleeding disorders
- Identify appropriate approaches to bullying in childhood
- Teaching stations include: Central Line Care, G-tube Care, Tracheotomy Care, Use of Simulators, Changes in Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation, Child Abuse, Nutrition, Wound Care and Coding. Demonstrations will use models, examples and handouts, individual discussion of what constitutes an emergency and actions to take, and local regulations. The objective is that the participant will be able to identify specific practical problems and the approaches necessary for their solution.
